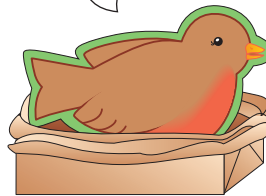


1. Start with a brown paper lunch bag approximately 6" wide.

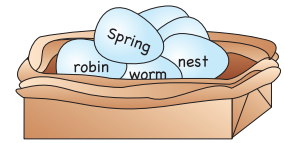


2. Roll and "scrunch" sides down toward the bottom of the bag.

Use the Spring words in a sentence, practice spelling words, or write story starters on the eggs.

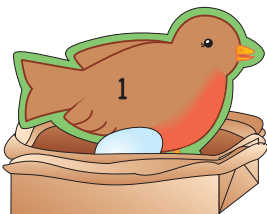


3. Create a nest that can hold the robin and eggs for game parts.

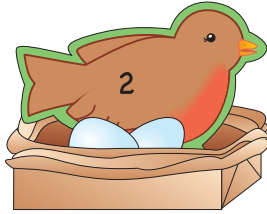


4. Make learning games with a Spring theme and vary the concepts to fit student needs.

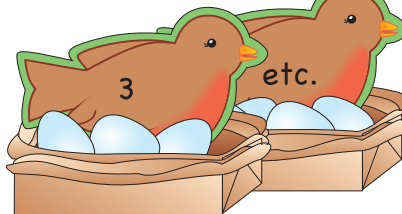
## Counting and Sorting Games



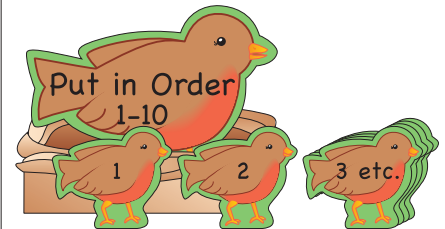
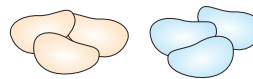
1. Make a nest for each numeral 1 - 10. Write the numeral on each robin and laminate for durability.



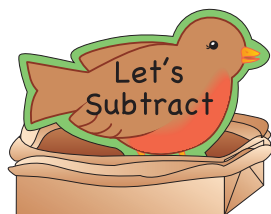
2. Make robins egg counters from light blue card stock. Cut them out with scissors or use an oval paper punch.



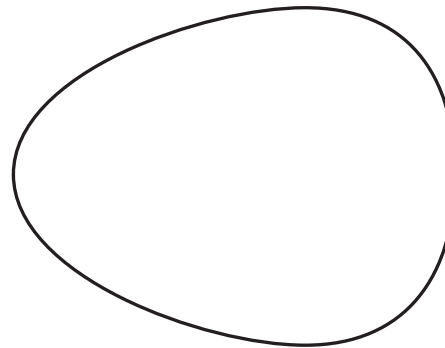
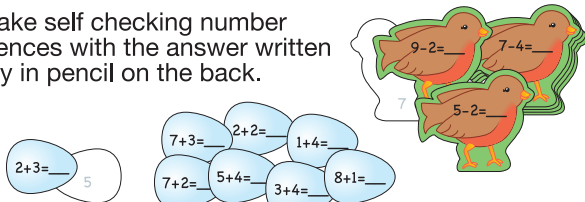
Optional: Spray paint large lima beans light blue for counters.
