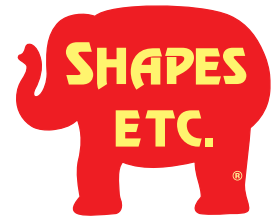


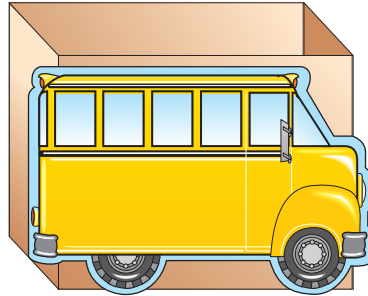
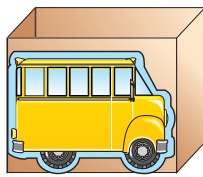
How to Make a School Bus Box

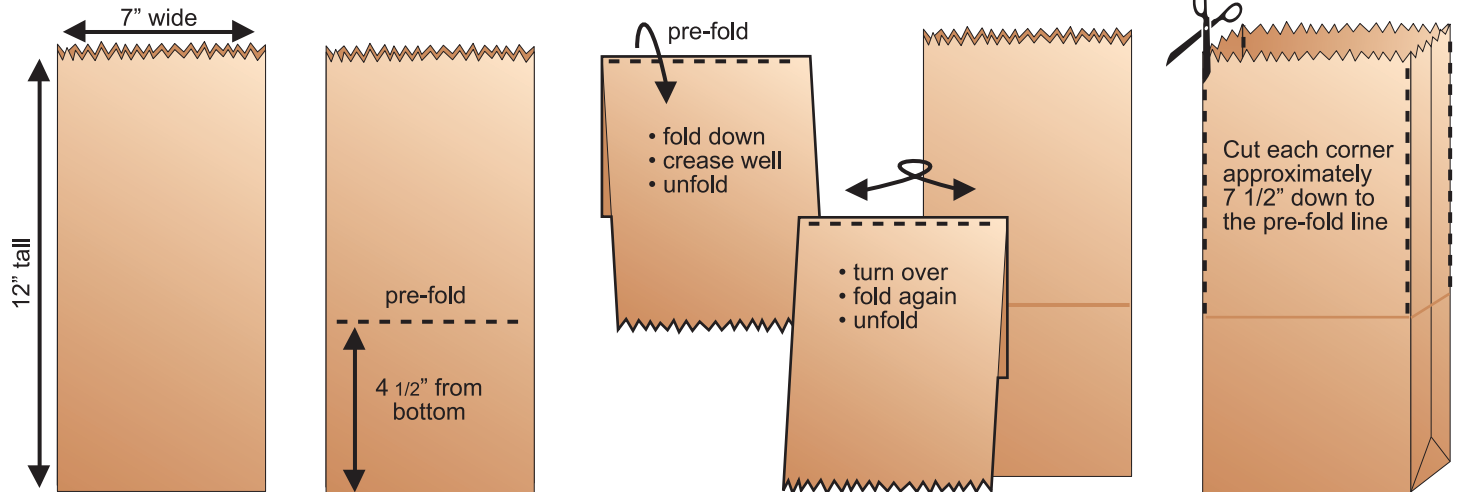

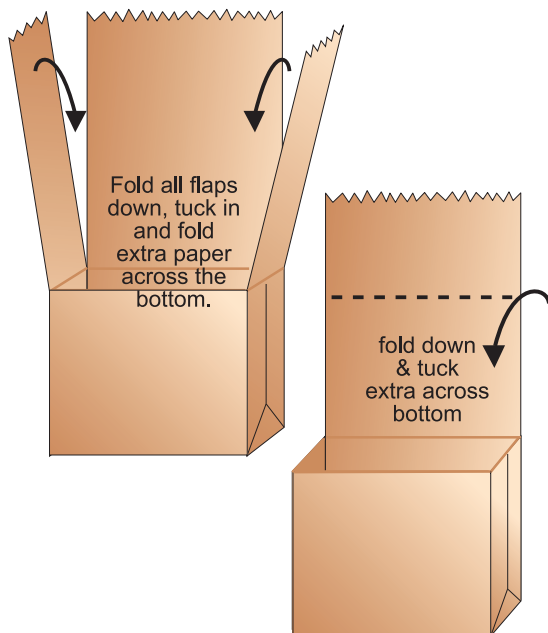


1. Start with a brown paper lunch bag approximately 7" wide. If the bag is less than 7" that's okay; the School Bus will just overhang the side edges a bit more.

2. Measure 4 1/2" from the bottom and pre-fold, then flip over and pre-fold on the back. The crease will give the paper a "memory" of where to fold down the flaps later.

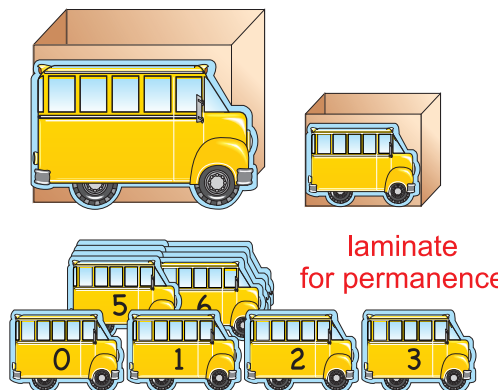
3. Cut down all four sides stopping at the pre-fold line approximately 7 1/2".

4. Fold down both side flaps and tuck in. Fold extra paper across the bottom. Repeat with front and back flaps. Optional: Use a glue stick to secure in place.



Variations:

- Use the Mini School Bus Notepads and small penny candy size paper bags.
- Use plastic toy people with the bags for counting games or, Connecting People™ from Learning Resources
- Use a milk carton that's been cut down and covered in construction paper or contact paper instead of a paper bag.
- Make bus song word cards
- What else can you think of?

- School Bus Notepad SE-122
- Scissors
- Ruler
- Glue Stick
