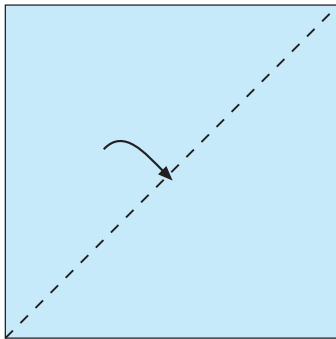


How to Make a Tri-o-rama!

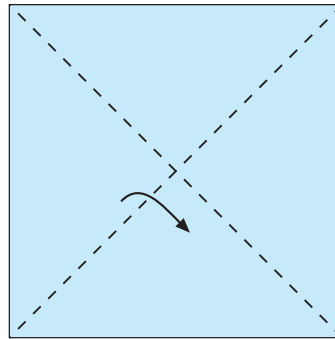

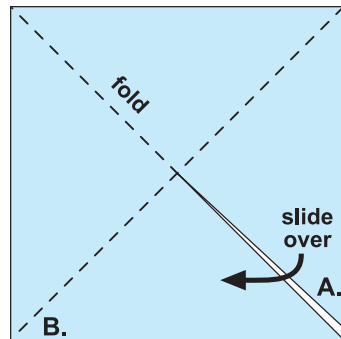
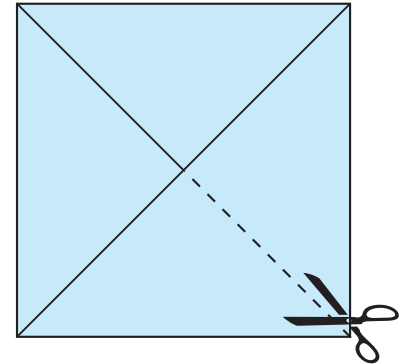
1. Start with a 12" x 12" square of construction paper. Fold in half, corner to corner, to form a triangle.



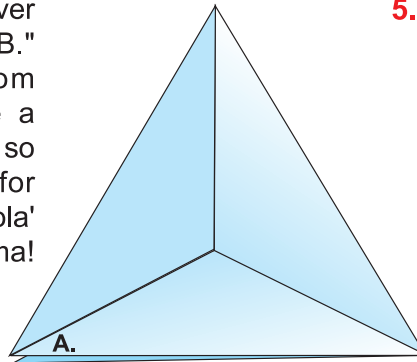
2. Unfold, turn and fold the opposite side. Flip over and refold diagonal again on back side.



3. Unfold and cut from one corner to the center as shown.



4. Slide point "A." over to match point "B." and glue bottom layers. Or, use a paperclip instead so it can collapse for easy storage. Viola! ...a 3-D Tri-o-rama!



5. Decorate with multi media and make a theme based creation... It could be the habitat for a favorite woodland animal, a slice of underwater life or, the interior of a pyramid... Use your imagination! The possibilities are endless!

Materials List:

- Collection of Shapes Etc.® Notepads
- Glue Stick
- Construction Paper cut in 12" x 12" squares and colored scraps for trim.
- Assorted paper scraps
- Colored Pencils
- Scissors
- Pencils
- Markers
- Crayons
- Ruler

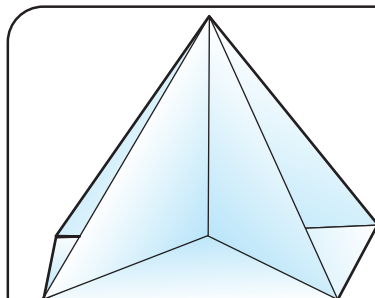
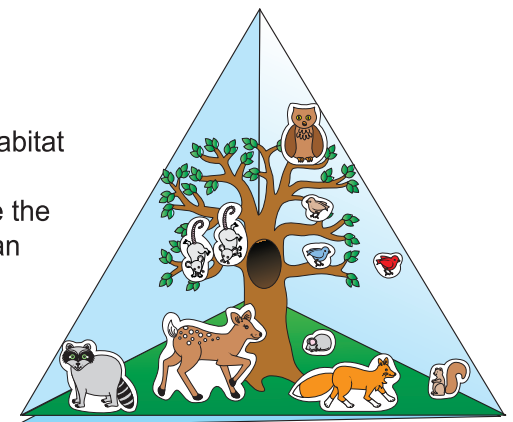
Optional:
